

2022 Graduate Student Exit Survey

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Methodology and Background

Instrument Design and Timeline

The American University of Armenia (AUA) conducted its 2022 *Graduate Student Exit Survey* from August 15 to September 1, 2022. Typically, this survey had been conducted in April based on petition to graduate lists in previous years. However, in 2022, unforeseen events led to a delay in conducting the survey, resulting in a lower response rate and data that may not be fully representative of the entire student population. Therefore, for the 2022 survey, only partial reporting is available, which includes the description of select questions and demographic information. Regrettably, the 2022 survey results will not be incorporated into the longitudinal reporting of the Graduate Student Exit Survey (for internal use only). The delay in conducting the survey and the resulting lower response rate have introduced potential biases and inconsistencies in the dataset, making it challenging to draw accurate and meaningful comparisons over time. While the 2022 survey may not have yielded a full set of results, the data collected still holds value in contributing to the ongoing assessment and improvement of the university's graduate programs.

The objectives of the survey were to gather information from graduate students about the level of student satisfaction related to the curriculum, academic environment, extracurricular activities, and services provided at the university, as well as to identify areas of possible improvements.

This report describes the methodology used for the survey and presents the findings in tables.

A total of 43 (31.6%) out of 136 graduating students participated in the survey. The results of 16 partially completed surveys were excluded in the analyses, **thus denoting a response rate of 19.9%**.

Description
