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Methodology

Instrument Design and Timeline

The American University of Armenia (AUA) conducted its 2021-2022 *Alumni Survey* from November 18, 2021 to December 9, 2021. The survey included alumni who graduated from 2016 – 2021. The survey was carried out by the university's Office of Institutional Research and Assessment with the support of the provost and the academic programs.

The objectives of the survey were to gather information from alumni about the level of satisfaction related to their AUA experience, current job and career, communication with AUA, and services provided by the university, as well as to identify areas of possible improvements.

The following procedures were followed:

• Three reminder email messages were sent by the Office of Institutional Research and Assessment (November 19, 2021, November 24, 2021, and November 29, 2021).

Responses were anonymous. Alumni were informed about the anonymity of their responses in the cover letters which also provided instructions on how to complete the questionnaire.

Demographic data were collected for analytics purposes.

The survey was sent to 2576 alumni. A total of 611 (23.7%) out of 2576 alumni participated in the survey. The results of 186 partially completed surveys were excluded from the analyses, thus **denoting a response rate of 16.4%**.

Description

Upon completion of the on-line survey, data was analyzed in SPSS. Descriptive analysis includes frequencies, cross-tabulations by the most recent year of graduation and previous five years combined, calculation of mean values for categorical variables with Likert scale type response options, calculation of median values for ordinal type of variables.

One-way ANOVA tests were run to detect the difference in the mean values of questions between academic programs for undergraduate-level alumni. One-way ANOVA was run between Colleges/School for graduate-level alumni because the program sample size was small. ANOVA tests were run only for the variables for which between-group variances were equal. Post-Hoc tests helped to identify the mean difference between particular academic programs (undergraduate) and Colleges/School (graduate). The significance level used for One-way ANOVA was 5%. The results of statistical tests are reported in the appendices.

Analyses are done by undergraduate and graduate levels separately. The report consists of four main parts: background, job and career, evaluation of AUA, and keeping in touch with AUA.

For statements that have a Not Applicable (N/A) response option, the mean value is calculated without including Not Applicable responses. The numbering of the responses in the appendices corresponds to the numbering in the survey questionnaire (see Appendix 6 for survey questionnaire).

In graduate-level results the report includes by-academic program analysis for several questions. However, it should be noted that the sample size for some programs is small.

Summary of Findings

Job and Career

- Approximately 59% of alumni indicated that AUA prepared them for their chosen career very well/generally well. In addition, in 2021, females rated their preparation for chosen career and further study significantly higher than males. (p. 27)
- ➤ 92.5% of alumni indicated that they work in a paid position. On average, approximately 67.2% of alumni are satisfied with their career progress. (p. 29-30)
- > 79.5% of AUA alumni reported working in their field of specialization. (p. 31)
- The information and communication industry has the highest proportion of employed alumni. (p. 31)
- ➤ The median salary of alumni is 200,000 300,000 AMD. Half of female alumni earn less than 300,000 AMD monthly net salary. (p. 32-33)
- Approximately 21% of alumni continued their education after completing their AUA degree. (p. 34)




The sample size for graduate level analysis is 231 and for undergraduate 173.




Out of 231 graduate alumni approximately 20% is MBA degree holders. Out of 173 undergraduate alumni approximately 50% are BAB degree holders.

More than 40% of both undergraduate and graduate alumni received tuition assistance including need-based scholarship.



In 2021, approximately 79.6% of alumni indicated that AUA prepared them for their chosen career very well/generally well.







The bar chart shows that alumni from MATEFL, MPH and MSM programs rated their preparedness for the chosen career or further studies higher compared to other programs.

In 2021, approximately 77.5% of alumni reported that AUA prepared them for their chosen career, lower compared to 2016-2020 alumni.




Longitudinal survey results indicate that there has been increase in the rating of preparedness for chosen career within unemployed alumni.

In the 2012 and 2015 alumni surveys, employed alumni rated their preparedness for their chosen career as generally well/very well, compared to unemployed alumni, a result that is not observed for the alumni who participated in 2018 and 2021 surveys.







In 2021, more than half of the alumni who graduated in 2016-2021 were employed prior to their graduation, and about 23.8% started working between 0-3 months after graduation.




88% of LL.M and 84% of MSE alumni indicated that were employed prior to graduation.



Longitudinal survey results indicate that the percentage of alumni who were employed prior to the graduation has steadily increased.




The vast majority of CSE alumni are employed in information and communication industry, while the majority of CHSS alumni are employed in education industry.

2021 survey results indicate that about 48% of MPSIA degree holders reported that their current position is not related to their field of study at AUA. In comparison, more than 90% of MSM, MSCIS and MPH degree holders reported working in a position related to their field of studies. In the 2021 survey, comparatively more MEIESM alumni reported working in a position related to their field of studies.


In 2021, the median salary is 300,000 - 400,000 AMD. More than 72% of alumni with MATEFL degree receive net salaries lower than 300,000 AMD.



The table below indicates that approximately 16% of MATEFL graduates receive salary lower than 100,000 AMD. In comparison, about 41% of MSCIS graduates and 31% of MPH graduates receive salary over 1,000,000 AMD.



The bar chart below shows the distribution of salaries by the level of current position. It can be observed that most of the alumni who work in entry level positions receive 100,000-200,000 AMD net salary. Alumni in mid-level positions mostly earn 200,000-300,000 AMD net salary. 400,000-600,000 AMD net salary is prevalent for senior level positions. And, approximately 45.5% of alumni in chief executive positions earn more than 1,000,000 AMD net salary.




More than half of male alumni earn more than 600,000 AMD monthly. More than 25% of female alumni earn less than 200,000 AMD monthly.




The bar chart above illustrates that the salary of female alumni is comparatively lower than the salary of male alumni.




How satisfied are you with your current employment in general and the following aspects of your position?

Cummulative % of Satisfied/very satisfied





How satisfied are you with the contribution to Armenia and the region of your current employment?








In 2021, 39.4% of alumni reported that AUA contributed to the development of their skills of submitting papers for publication.


The bar chart above illustrates that there is a statistically significant difference in rating the contribution of AUA in developing one's English writing skills between CHSS and CBE colleges, and a significant difference in rating the contribution of AUA in the ability to apply scientific methods of inquiry between CHS, CSE and CBE colleges.

In 2021, 92.5% of alumni would recommend AUA to prospective students.





Overall, approximately 90.7% of alumni are net promoters of AUA¹. 92.5% of alumni agree/strongly agree with the statement that they would recommend AUA to prospective students.




The bar chart on the left suggests that MEIESM alumni are less likely to recommend AUA to prospective students compared to the other programs.


The longitudinal table illustrates that more than 80% of AUA alumni are promoters of AUA.

The bar chart on the left illustrates the statistically significant difference between the rating of the skills needed in the field provided by the program between the CBE, CHS and CHSS alumni.


The longitudinal table indicates that more than 75% of AUA alumni agree/strongly agree that their program provided them with skills needed in their field.


Evaluation of AUA: Graduate Level

For 2021 alumni survey, Pearson's correlation was calculated between "my program provided me with the skills needed in my field" and "overall, how well do you think AUA prepared you for your chosen career or further study." As a result, there was a <u>statistically significant positive correlation</u> between these two statements (correlation coefficient=0.617, p=0.000). In addition, "my program provided me with the skills needed in my field" is <u>statistically</u> <u>significantly positively correlated</u> with the statement about recommending AUA to prospective students (correlation coefficient=0.471, p=0.000).

It can be observed from the scatter plot charts below that those who agreed/strongly agreed that their program provided them with skills needed in their field:

- > were promoters of AUA to prospective students,
- rated higher their overall preparedness for their chosen career or further study.








Please indicate your level of satisfaction with alumni services provided by AUA




MEIESM alumni have the lowest satisfaction level with the with the alumni services provided by AUA.

How would you evaluate the information you receive from AUA?




The bar chart shows that significant difference in the evaluation of information received from AUA between males and females, after adjusting for colleges.




Overall, how well do you think AUA prepared you for your chosen career or further study?

In 2021, females rated their preparation for chosen career and further study significantly higher than males.


Overall, how well do you think AUA prepared you for your chosen career or further study?

Alumni who graduated in 2021 rated the preparation of AUA to their chosen career and further study higher than the 2020 alumni.




The bar chart above illustrates the statistically significant difference in the satisfaction level with the intellectual challenges posed by the current employment between the CHSS and CSE alumni.






Is your current position related to your field(s) of study at AUA?




Approximate individual monthly salary after taxes (in AMD)























Please indicate to what extent your graduate education at AUA contributed to your development in the following areas









The bar chart above illustrates the statistically significant difference in the level of agreement with the statement that their AUA experiences were relevant to their career goals between CBE and CHSS alumni.


How would you rate your overall experience at AUA?








Pearson's correlation was calculated between "my program provided me with the skills needed in my field" and "overall, how well do you think AUA prepared you for your chosen career or further study." As a result, there was a **statistically significant positive correlation** between these two statements (correlation coefficient=0.510, p=0.000). In addition, "my program provided me with the skills needed in my field" is **statistically significantly positively correlated** with the statement about recommending AUA to prospective students (correlation coefficient=0.381, p=0.000).

It can be observed from the scatter plot charts below that those who agreed/strongly agreed that their program provided them with skills needed in their field:






