

Methodology and Background

Instrument Design and Timeline

The American University of Armenia (AUA) conducted the 2023 Undergraduate Student Exit Survey from June 20 to July 4, 2023. Typically, this survey is conducted during April the same year. However, in 2023, due to unforeseen events led to a delay in conducting the survey, resulting in a lower response rate and data that may not be fully representative of the entire student population. Therefore, for the 2023 survey, only partial reporting is available, which includes the description of select questions and demographic information. Regrettably, the 2023 survey results will not be incorporated into the longitudinal reporting of the Freshman Student Exit Survey (for internal use only). The delay in conducting the survey and the resulting lower response rate have introduced potential biases and inconsistencies in the dataset, making it challenging to draw accurate and meaningful comparisons over time. While the 2023 survey may not have yielded a full set of results, the data collected still holds value in contributing to the ongoing assessment and improvement of the university's undergraduate programs.

The objectives of the survey were to gather information from freshman students about their first-year experience, academic environment, extracurricular activities, satisfaction with services provided at the university, and expectations for upcoming academic year, as well as to identify areas of possible improvements.

This report describes the methodology used for the survey.

The survey population included 476 freshman students.

An email was sent to all freshman students on June 4 highlighting the importance of the survey, encouraging participation and providing a direct link to the online survey. One reminder email was sent on July 27, 2023.

A total of 133 (27.9%) out of 476 freshman students participated in the survey. The results of 63 partially completed surveys were excluded from the analyses, **thus denoting a response rate of 14.7%**.
